

Mass Movement Project

Overview: Your project will be centered around one Mass Movement type of your choice. The final project is due **Wednesday, February 6th** to be presented to and graded by your peers.

Entries: Select a variety of examples of work from the list below that will total **50 points**. I suggest one entry from each section, but you may choose differently. Remember, your work should be neatly done in ink or typed.

Directions: Entry selection will consist of two things:

- Entry summary: On a 3x5 index card should be written or typed summary. Your summary should include your name as well as a caption and reflection. The caption is a one or two sentence description of the entry, and the reflection is a brief discussion as to why you chose to do the entry and what you like about it.
- The Entry itself.

20 Point Entries:

- ❖ **Report:** Write a 2 page (minimum) report about your Movement of Choice. Discuss the ways the movement begins, its effects on humanity, forces/conditions involved in how the mass movement works, etc. Use at least two different sources. Include a title page, reference page (done properly - check online for Purdue Owl for help), and must be double spaced with size 12 font (typed) or 3 pages handwritten.
- ❖ **3D Model:** Make a three-dimensional model of the Movement of your Choice. If you chose to do this model, feel free to do a demonstration or do a static model. Write a short description of your model on 3x5 card explaining your model, what is happening and what each part of your model represents.
- ❖ **Short Story:** Write a fictional short story which includes your Movement of Choice. BE CREATIVE! The story must have PLOT! This must be three pages minimum, double spaced, size 12 font (type) or 4 pages written.
- ❖ **Song:** Compose as song, minimum of three verses, about your Movement of Choice. You can use a familiar melody (tell me what it is - keep it simple) or compose your own. The song must be performed and turned in on a CD or video.

15 Point Entries:

- ❖ **Collage:** Make and 8x10 inch or larger collage about your Movement of Choice. A collage is a collection of pictures centered around a theme (your Movement of Choice in this case). In a collage, the background should be entirely filled (none of the background paper should be seen at all) with pictures that are pasted onto it. Suggestion: Put the larger pictures on first, and fill in with smaller pictures.
- ❖ **Parody:** A parody is an exaggerated comedy imitation of a literary or musical work or style (think Weird Al songs). Choose a song, story, poem or make up your own surrounding any Mass Movement discussed in class as well as your own.

10 Point Entries:

- ❖ **Cartoon:** Draw a cartoon, minimum of 5 panels, which is centered around your Mass Movement.
- ❖ **Crossword Puzzle:** Create a crossword puzzle about your Mass Movement. A minimum of 15 words and definitions are required. Be sure to include an answer key!!

5 Point Entries:

- ❖ **Wordsearch:** Create a wordsearch, 15 words minimum, about your Mass Movement. Include an answer key!!
- ❖ **Joke:** Write a FUNNY joke about your Mass Movement. MAKE ME LAUGH!
- ❖ **Limerick:** Make a limerick about your Mass Movement. A Limerick follows this pattern:
 - A kind of humorous verse of five lines, in which the first, second, and fifth lines rhyme with each other, and the third and fourth lines, which are shorter, form a rhymed couplet.
